Rend Our Hearts: 2023 Lenten

Yet even now, says the Lord,
return to me with all your heart,
with fasting, with weeping, and with mourning;
rend your hearts and not your clothing.
Return to the Lord your God,
for he is gracious and merciful,
slow to anger, abounding in steadfast love,
and relenting from punishment.

(Joel 2:12-13 NRSVUE)

Joel challenges us to be sincere this Lenten season. We can fast, not eat lunch and spent that time in prayer, and use the money we would have spent on lunch for good in our community or family. Rend your hearts, not your clothing. Joel tells us, and this Lenten season I pray we can follow this example. If you are intending to give up something, make it more meaningful than just sacrificing an old shirt or coat that you were intending to throw a way this coming summer.

Christian rituals, for the most part, reflect our inward beliefs being manifested in outward actions. We celebrate Holy Communion by physically taking a piece of bread and chewing it and taking a cup of juice and drinking it. The internalization of physical elements blessed are symbolic of the sacrifice Jesus gave on the cross. This Lent, take time to seriously consider your commitment to God as you spend time in devotion seeking God's direction in your life.

Repentance, reconciliation, and repair require a change of mind, body, and spirit. This change is complex and requires those inward and outward transformations. Allowing the internal changes in our lives are difficult. The pandemic forced us to think about both changes in our lives. That is the reason we saw so much confusion and distress: wear a mask, don't wear a mask, take a vaccine, take various medications and you will not need a vaccine. Three years later we have made the internal and external changes in our lives to deal with the virus. Many have been vaccinated and a lot have achieved immunity through exposure. Many died but we are learning those internal and external lessons as we live with the Covid-19 virus.

We start Lent with the external marking of ashes on our forehead and we will end with the internal consumption of Holy Communion on Easter Sunday morning to celebrate the Resurrection of Jesus our Savior. Let us follow this external and internal path that Joel has inspired us to take this Lenten season. Credit to Rev. Cheryl A. Lindsay

COUNCIL CORNER FOR JANUARY 2023

Apostle: Glen provided a detailed outline for the upcoming Mardi Gras celebration.

<u>Deacon:</u> The January financial report was presented to the council and approved by unanimous vote.

A printout of all monthly expenses was presented to help council members get a better idea of all that is paid out each month.

Our treasurer Patty was given council approval to use the "dial in" option for Quick Books to give her access to accounts at home when needed.

Elder: For the month of January the Food Pantry served 104 families for a total of 162 people. More seniors seem to be the main recipients of the pantry service.

The pantry is working with the local area Ruritan clubs to get financial support for the pantry since our pantry serves the entire area.

The pantry was able to obtain an accordion style roller system to help with our food deliveries in the pantry storage area.

Church business: The area's Habitat for Humanity build for 2023 will begin in April. It was voted and approved to increase the church support to \$7000 since this is our 7^{th} build we are involved in.
